Dear Dr. Loney,

As part of our commitment to providing the highest quality patient care possible, and as part of the educational experience at the Cleveland University Chiropractic Health Center, we train our chiropractic interns on how to co-manage patient care and how to effectively communicate with other healthcare providers. This letter has been sent to you today with authorization of our patient Mr. Clark Griswold.

Mr. Griswold presented to our health center on 12/27/2021 with a reported chief complaint of pain in his right upper back that started when he lifted an oversized Christmas tree and placed it on the top of his station wagon on or around 12/23/2021. A thorough history and examination, including thoracic spine x-rays, were performed. Our current working diagnosis is mild thoracic spine strain with concurrent segmental joint dysfunction and associated thoracic spine osteoarthritis.

At this time, our recommended course of care includes a trial of 4-6 visits. He will receive treatment that includes gentle chiropractic adjustments and soft tissue therapies twice a week over the next 2-3 weeks with an anticipated re-exam date of January 14, 2022. In addition, Mr. Griswold will be asked to do limited focused home care exercises as the condition allows. Our goal is to help him become pain free and allow him to swim without limitation. His prognosis is good and it is anticipated that he will return to MMI within 4-6 weeks. If the initial course of care is successful, as expected, Mr. Griswold will be encouraged to continue until he reaches MMI, and will subsequently be referred back to you for future considerations.
